NEXT ALP CONVENTION IN FORT WAYNE, INDIANA AT THE LINCOLN MUSEUM April 19 - 21, 2002

The Lincoln Museum in Fort Wayne, Indiana has been chosen as the headquarters for the 8th annual convention of the Association of Lincoln Presenters, April 19 - 21, 2002.

Vandalia, Illinois - in May it was known that the Old State Capitol in Vandalia was closed for a renovation project and was to be reopened in March. However, in July asbestos was discovered in the Capitol, and it could not be removed in time for our convention. Vandalia requested year 2004 instead.

Since Lincoln City, Indiana was chosen for convention in year 2003, we asked if they would like it in year 2002. They gave extenuating circumstances why they would prefer to have it in year 2003.

The by-laws of the ALP call for our convention to be held in a place where Lincoln walked in even years such as 2002. That narrowed the field Bloomington, Illinois and Fort Wayne, Indiana, both of which had officially invited the ALP. Both cities sent a proposal for the convention. I discussed these with the vice-presidents and members of the board. For several reasons (including illness and fees), Fort Wayne was chosen over Bloomington, without bad feelings resulting.

The Lincoln Museum in Fort Wayne is one of the largest repositories of Lincoln artifacts in America. Their library is a major source of information about Abraham and Mary Lincoln. Their gift shop sells many Lincoln items and books and will offer our members a ten percent discount on purchases. The Lincoln Museum has graciously offered the Association of Lincoln Presenters complimentary access to their facility for this weekend in April, 2002. They have waived their normal rental fees and are going all out to offer the ALP an exceptional experience.

A local committee has been formed of people from Fort Wayne and Indiana. The head of this committee is Larry Givens of Fort Wayne. The committee has three members from Fort Wayne plus four others from Indiana. They are developing the plan for this convention.

The Holiday Inn will be our central hotel. It is two blocks from the Lincoln Museum. Cars will not be necessary, and ladies in hoop skirts should have no problem. The Holiday Inn has a free shuttle to and from the Ft. Wayne airport. For reservations call 1-800 - HOLIDAY or (219) 422-5511. Room rate is \$67.
